Division

Mr. Pickersgill: It seems to me that that is very adequately covered by the amendment. There is no suggestion here that one has to cite the exact words in order to accomplish that purpose.

Mr. Speaker: The citation referred to by the hon. member, citation 415 of Beauchesne's fourth edition, seems to cover the principle of the situation at this time. The other point made was as to its vagueness. The other consideration is as to whether the amendment tends to change a principle approved on second reading. I think it does not do the latter. It has not been held that amendments are not in order because they are vague or completely unintellible even. On the whole I think this amendment is one that should be put and I will proceed to do so.
