INQUIRY AS TO EXTENSION OF FREE TRADE POLICY

On the orders of the day:

Mr. A. D. Hales (Wellington South): Mr. Speaker, I would like to address my question to the Minister of Trade and Commerce. It arises from a statement he made while addressing the Canadian Importers Association in Toronto last evening. He said, very briefly:

Canada, with its limited population, can evi-dently not support the entire range of diversified products demanded by its consumers. Nor can it afford the cost of entering into research in design and technological improvement for all product lines.

Is the government intending, with this assumption, to extend the free trade policy that is set out in the Canada-U.S. auto treaty to other industries such as clothing, textiles, appliances and aircraft?

Hon. Mitchell Sharp (Minister of Trade and Commerce): Mr. Speaker, the negotiations for further reductions in Canadian tariffs will be made in the multilateral negotiations now proceeding in Geneva under the Kennedy round. I am not in a position, of course, to reveal any negotiations which have taken place, which is the position taken by all participating countries.

Mr. Hales: A supplementary question. Would the Minister like to say whether arrangements have been made with the furniture manufacturers along this same line?
