Question No. 3,544—Mr. MacDonald (Egmont):

1. With reference to the agricultural sector of Phase 2 of the PEI Comprehensive Development Plan, what are the working definitions used by the DREE office in PEI of a viable and a potentially viable farm operation?

2. From 1969 to date, for each category of farm operation classified as (a) viable (b) potentially viable (c) non-viable (d) all farms, what is the (i) number (ii) total acreage (iii) average acreage (iv) total acreage under cultivation (v) average acreage under cultivation (vi) total net family income (all sources) (vii) average net family income (all sources) (viii) total farm net income (ix) average farm net income (x) distribution by county?

3. (a) What programmes are designed primarily to help the (i) viable (ii) potentially viable (iii) non-viable farm operation (b) in what way do these programmes represent a departure from the agricultural strategy of Phase 1 of the Plan?
