Dear Sir Arthur :

During the Provincial Exhibition in Amherst, I had the pleasure of demonstrating to you our Automatic Train Control which you seemed to be interested in.

I have been working very hard on this piece of work for some time, and as you are aware the Railways of Canada do not pay very much attention to Automatic Train Control on account of the enormous expense it will put the Railways to. This being the case, we must have patience in Canada and continue as we are, demonstrating it to the public, to the officials of the Railways, and to the Railway Commission, until such time as they see fit to give us consideration.

The American Railways are compelled to install Automatic Train Control by the Interstate Commerce Commission at Washington, and it is our intention during the first of the year to take our model on the American side and exhibit it there during January, February and March. We will have this model at Chicago during the National Railway Appliances Association Exhibition held in the Coliseum the second week in March.

Sir Arthur, we need some influential people to recommend us in order that we may be able to approach and be granted an interview with Americans who are in a position to assist us.

We would like to have a letter of introduction or a letter of some kind to the Governor
