A minor subject may be chosen (I) if the permissions of both the major and minor departments are obtained. The amount of work in the minor must receive the approval of the head of the minor department. If it is OH desired to take isolated courses outside the major department, this may be done merely with the approval of the major department, but in this case the extra work may not be termed a The reasons for giving a degree of M. Com. should be invest-(2) igated carefully before making this departure. If the candidate is worthy of a higher university degree, he should qualify for an M.A. (3) The reasons for giving an M.S.A. degree are debatable. universal M. Sc. for all branches of pure and applied science seems more appropriate than singling out one or two for special titles, unless corresponding distinctions are made, such as M. Eng., for the master's degree in Engineering. It is obvious that the suggested rules about the M.S.A. will (rightly or wrongly) appear unfair to the Agricultural School and doubtless stir them to resentment. I would suggest that they should clearly define their desires, before the Faculty revises the rules about their degrees.
