They settled in the town of Weathersfield, near the village of Reading, where, after raising a family of children, both died, she at the age of 63, and he at the age of 83.

On the breaking out of the war of 1812 he enlisted at the age of 49, in Jan., 1813, in Capt Marston's Company, 21st Regiment U.S. Infantry, and served until Oct. 5, 1814, when he was discharged at Fort Erie, Canada, on surgeon's certificate of disability.

His son-in-law, Robert White, lost both arms by a cannon shot at the battle of Fort Erie, Canada, not far from Buffalo, N. Y., in August, 1814.
