She is considered due at Barbadoes about the fourth week of her departure.

No. 4. Demerara direct; after landing her mails there, she proceeds, the next tide, to Berbice, where she remains three days. She returns to Demerara, and from thence to Barbadoes. In fifteen days she may be expected to return.

N. B. The mails are closed at the Post Office at 3 o'clock P. M. on the days of sailing.

The two monthly mails are made up at the Post Office, St. Martin's-le-Grand, London, on the first and third Wednesdays in each month, and the regular times for the sailing of the packets from Falmouth, are the Saturdays next following the first and third Wednesdays in each month. Each packet is considered to be due at Barbadoes five weeks after the regular time of her sailing from Falmouth.
