THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL F9.

An Act for the relief of Frank Maun James.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Frank Maun James, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Verdun, in the province of Quebec, has by his petition alleged that on the fourth day of May, A.D. 1929, at the said city, he and Grace Victoria Fox, who was then of the said city, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with 10 the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Frank Maun James and Grace Victoria Fox, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes 15 whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Frank Maun James may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Grace Victoria Fox had not been solemnized.
