II. Selections from Periodicals.

1. THE POPULATION OF THE EARTH.

Teachers will find much valuable information in Behm and Wagner's statistical work on the population of the globe. As the work may not be accessible to many of our teachers, we have compiled the following interesting statistics from it. It is estimated that the whole population of the globe for the present year amounts to 1,423,917,000, and the area of land surface they calculate to be 51,340,800 square miles, thus giving an average density of about 28 people to one square mile. These data are apportioned among the various divisions of the globe as nearly as possible as follows:
