A panic swept through the bear ranks to day. Rumorr were current early of a more peaceful turn in the relations between Spain and the United States, and Washington advices asserted that the Sagasta Ministry had agreed to accept the reported plan of President McKinley for feeding the reconcentrados and for mediation between Spain and the insurgents. The prospects of a peaceful solution of the Cuban complications caused extensive purchases for both accounts. The excitement in the morning was intense, and prices rose 4 to 5 per cent. on the average. Realizations caused a reaction of 1 to 2 per cent. in the afternoon and some bear selling was renewed on reports of dissatisfaction in Congress with the President's conservative policy. Sugar was extremely active. It rose 9½ per cent, reacted about 4 per cent, and then recovered part of the reaction. Metropolitan Street Railway advanced over 11 per cent, and retained nearly all the gain. Manhattan enjoyed a violent recovery of over 8 points, but lost half the gain later. The movements in other parts of the market had more or less of the same valuable characteristics. The market closed at general material advances, but somewhat unsettled and with a feverish tone.
