Remarkable Novel Aimed at Higher Criticism Forecasts What Might Happen if the Resurrection Were Proved to Be a Myth.

According to Kipling and other equally good authorities, there are only two stories in the world, and these have all been told, and, indeed, it seems as if the modern fiction did not repeat itself. It has remained, however, for Mr. Guy Thorne, an English writer, to give novel readers a really new sensation. He has done this in a book called "When It Was Dark," a novel with so remarkable a theme and such an original plot, that it really deserves, in spite of its obvious faults, to obtain more than the average share of attention for a work of fiction.

The book is aimed at the higher criticism. The "great conspiracy" of the title is one to destroy the faith of Christendom and to lead the history of the world.
