The next witness called by the crown, Corp. F. W. Zaneth, R.N.W. M.P., an Italian, who acted as a secret service agent during the period following Sept. 12, 1918, testified he was sent out to the Drumheller district in Alberta, where he worked for some time around the mines. He then, he said, came into Calgary, where (smiling), "I got mixed up with Socialists." He said he was "converted" to Socialism by George Sangster, in Calgary, a member of the local Socialist party of Canada. At a later date he acted in the capacity of an organizer for the Socialist party of Canada and distributed much literature for them. The witness said that he was introduced to the accused Russell by Joe Knight of Edmonton in the convention room at the labor conference in Calgary in March, 1919.

Mr. Russell, he said, was introduced as one of the executives of the Socialist party of Canada and he (the witness) went under the name of Chass.

As a Socialist, said the witness, he attended numerous meetings of the party—almost one every night. These meetings were divided into business meetings, meetings to discuss economics and meetings where "converts" were target the art of speaking. The idea of teaching people to speak was so that they could go out and talk along Socialistic lines, said the witness, and he gave a resume of what he meant by gave a resume of what he meant by saying that such speakers spoke about the workers having nothing in common with the upper class; that they should organize so that they would not be exploited; and that their doctrine should be production for use of all and not for the profit of the few.

These discussions, he said often turned to talk of a general strike, and also revolution. Trotzky and Lenine were held up as the greatest men in the world, and the establishing of a Soviet form of government in Canada was also discussed.

As soon as the aldermen left the council chamber they went into a secret conference behind closed doors. It was intimated following the conference by one of the aldermen that the police commission would be one of the principal issues before the new city council to be elected in January. The same aldermen also stated that Ald. Bitzer and Bowman, who were the quarry of the mob on Monday night, were unusually quiet at the secret conference this afternoon, having very little to say.




