NEIGHBORS DECLARE WOMAN WHO KILLED STEPDAUGHTER, SANE

Jail Physician Also Finds No Deficiency.

Quebec, April 20 .- The legal and medcal battle that is to be waged in the criminal court as to the sanity of Marie Anne Houde, wife of Telesphore Gagnon, charged with slowly torturing to death her stepdaughter, Aurore Gagnon, was continued at today's hearing. The prosecution introduced neighbors of the Gagnons at St. Philomene De Lotbiniere, and they totalled that in their related Gagnons at St. Philomene De Lotbiniere, and they testified that in their relations and intercourse with the accused she never showed signs of mental deficiency, or insanity. 


