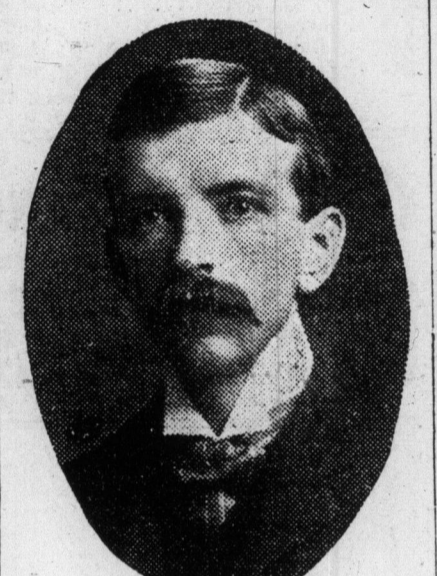

EAST TORONTO.

Strenuous Fight for Every Office in East Toronto.

EAST TORONTO, Jan. 6.—By an overwhelming vote Andrew McMillan to-day defeated Mayor John McP. Ross and ex-Mayor John Richardson by a plurality over both of 158, the vote standing: McMillan 504, Ross 251 and Richardson 95.

The election was one of the most keenly fought out in recent years and the fact that local option was one of the features of the contest added greatly to the interest. By a curious coincidence the vote was: for 414 and against 414, ensuring the defeat of the measure under the three-fifths clause.

The bylaw to raise \$10,000 for the waterworks was carried by a large majority. Andrew McMillan, the new mayor, is personally one of the most popular men in town and has for a number of years been prominently identified with the business interests of East Toronto, and at present has a large interest in the big lumbering firm of L. A. De LaPlante, Ltd.

Prior to the incorporation of the town Mr. McMillan was in municipal life as Reeve. His defeat of Mayor Ross, personally a most likeable man,

as well as of ex-Mayor Richardson, is a great victory for the incoming mayor.
