RUSSIAN FLEET FINDS WAY OUT OF TEUTON NET

Berlin Says Russian Warships Are Out of Moon Sound, Bound North.

INTENTION NOT PLAIN

Russians May Risk Battle or May Be Making for Port of Revel.

London, Oct. 21.—The Russian fleet has started northward from Moon Sound, possibly with the intention of endeavoring to escape thru the tortuous channels and maze of islands lying between them and the Gulf of Finland.

ENVELOPING MOVEMENT OF BRITISH ROUTS TURKS

Moslem Forces in Mesopotamia Are Driven Across Diala River.

London, Oct. 21.—British troops in Mesopotamia, on Friday, began an enveloping movement near the Persian frontier, northwest of Bagdad, and drove the Turkish forces in the vicinity of Kizil-Robat across the Diala River.

GAINS FOR THE BRITISH IN E. AFRICAN CAMPAIGN

Battle Near Nyangao Results in a Defeat for the Huns--Both Sides Lose Heavily in Fierce Fighting.

London, Oct. 21.—Heavy fighting is going on between British and Teuton forces in German East Africa. The British War Office announced today that the mission station of Nyangao was occupied by the British on October 17, after which the battle was resumed to the west of that place.

PROVES KAISER PRECIPITATED THE GREAT WAR

Official Card Found Setting Date of Hun Mobilization July 17.

SHOWS HUN GUILT

Kaiser Lined Up His Forces Before Any of the Other Nations.

Newark, N.J., Oct. 21.—Conclusive evidence that Germany mobilized her forces long before the date on which she admits having done so, has been obtained by the arrest by department of justice agents, of Christopher Schurrer, a graduate of the University of Leipzig, having degrees in surgery and arts, it was announced here today.

BRITISH FLEET SHELLS OSTEND; BIG GUNS ACTIVE

Much Damage Done to Foe U-Boat Base By Shells From Warships.

INFANTRY INACTIVE

Reciprocal Bombardments and Raids on the Various Major Fronts.

London, Oct. 21.—British naval craft have heavily bombarded the port of Ostend, Belgium, which is being used by the Germans as a submarine base. The German official statement says numerous houses in the town were damaged by the shells from the naval guns.

BRITISH AIRSHIP SINKS TWO GERMAN U-BOATS

Admiralty Describes Further Exciting Adventures Ending in Destruction of Submarines--Officer Tows Mine to Shallow Water.
