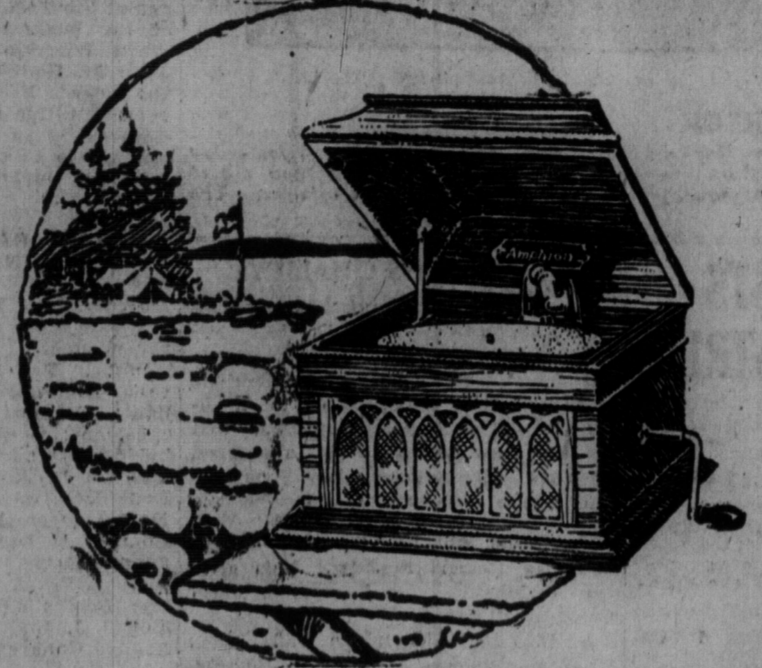

He declares the action taken by that party to be absurd, and affirms that the campaign is in the charge of the referendum committee; that the action of the alliance in participating in the fight will cause confusion, and warns county committees against the alliance financial plans.

**TO COMMEMORATE WORK OF SIR WILLIAM RAMSAY**

McCallum, chairman of the honorary advisory board of Toronto University on scientific and industrial research, has been notified that a Ramsay scholarship of the value of \$1,500 a year has been given to the board by the Canadian Council for Research. The Ramsay fellowships are to commemorate the work of the late Sir William Ramsay.

**URGENT ESTABLISHMENT OF INDIAN FOREIGN MISSION**

Hamilton Methodists have sent a proposal to the Methodist Foreign Mission Board, Toronto, that Canada establish a foreign mission under the British flag, preferably in India.

Mr. Justice Kelly yesterday decided that the daughters of the deceased Sir Sandford Fleming, pioneer of the "All-red" cable scheme, are entitled to share with their three brothers in the homestead as part of the residuary estate of their father. The sons claimed the property as their exclusive property.

In the county court yesterday, Judge Ward dismissed the action brought by the Gilson Manufacturing Company against Ira Nichols, a farmer, of Burgessville, to recover \$238 alleged owing for a silo filler.

**RED CROSS LODGE BOON TO WOUNDED**

The Charming Surroundings Make Orthopedic Hospital Annex Gathering Spot.

Tangible evidence of the peace work of the Red Cross is seen at the Red Cross lodge of the Orthopedic Hospital on Christie street, which is now known to thousands of visitors, who since its establishment, have found it a happy meeting place when they have gone to visit friend or relative among the men at the hospital. Yesterday when a representative of the World paid a call the gate leading to the grounds stood hospitably open, and following the narrow path, the Lodge came full into view. Across the front of the restful grey building a large black sign carried the inscription in gold letters "Canadian Red Cross Lodge," and on either side a large red cross, and a large wreath of white flowers on stands on the verandah, and behind the house was rising wooded ground, and in front a spacious stretch of lawn.

**WILL SUBMIT LISTS OF PUBLIC SCHOOL SITES**

Business Administrator Pearse of the board of education will submit a list of prospective sites for new public school buildings to a sub-committee of the property committee this afternoon. The meeting will be held behind closed doors, and the members of the sub-committee on sites will be pledged to treat the information furnished to them as strictly confidential.

**CHURCH LOANS PLOT TO RECREATION CLUB**

Clinton Street Methodist Church has given over its vacant land for vacation purposes to a union of five congregations. They have formed an interchurch recreation club with four tennis courts, one basketball court, two bowling greens for the summer and two hockey cushions for the winter. The congregations represented are College Street Presbyterian Church, Christ Church, Reformed Episcopal, St. Stephen's Anglican, Cecil and Bathurst Street Disciples Churches, and the Clinton Street Methodist.

**LAUNCH HEARTLESSLY DESERTS SINKING CREW—RESCUED BY ANOTHER.**

A hydroplane, while making a trial flight over the lake last night, crashed into the water and subsequently sank, although the pilot and mechanic were rescued, unharmed.

**LAUNCH SHOOTS OFF**

While their machine was on the surface of the water and only needed a tow to bring it to safety, a motor launch approached and was signalled by the distressed men. The boat, however, after coming to within 100 feet, turned and left them. Another launch, belonging to Russell H. Armour Jr., of 305 Jarvis street, then came to their rescue. It was then too late to save the plane. During the efforts to tow it to shore it sank, a loss of \$12,000. The machine, which was a three-seater, weighed 3,000 pounds, had a 480-horse engine of 180 horsepower, and was insured.
