

Ottawa, January 2nd, 1936.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 19th ultimo, asking for a distribution of timber money to the Indians of Ueluelet Band, I would advise that a cheque for \$1,480.00 has gone forward to you to enable you to make a distribution at \$10.00 per capita.

The total proceeds from the sale of timber was \$15,198.06. Fifty per cent of this would make \$7,599.00 available for distribution to the Indians. In February last, there was distributed \$1,450.00 and in April \$2,900.00 and now \$1,480.00 which will leave a balance undistributed of \$1,769.00.

The distribution should be made as soon as you can and pay-lists, in duplicate, submitted here accounting for the advance remitting any balance undistributed using as a basis the last pay-list and be careful in submitting the duplicate that it is an exact copy of the original. You will also make a third copy to be kept in your office for reference.
