Russia has admitted that the war cost in excess of \$1,000,000,000 and Japan's expenditures, it is believed, could not have been much less than that. That Japan may issue, a new loan for refunding purposes was the opinion of a high banking authonity. "It is pay ing a high rate of interest on some of its hoans," said he, "and it is a matter of necessity that this should be reduced. Japan cannot stand this strain of a high interest rate, for the reason that its re-sources are not adequate. It is not a rich mation by any means, and while its internest now." Japan has just iseed a fnew interned-loan of \$25,000,000, which is intended to assist in meeting the \$400, 000,000 expenses resulting from the war with Russia, such as the interest on the war debts, annuities, pensions, the main-tenance of garrisons in Manchuria whose services in the field are not need ed. Of the new \$215,000,000 loan, \$100,-000,000 will be raised in the market for the purpose of redgeming exchequer bonds.
