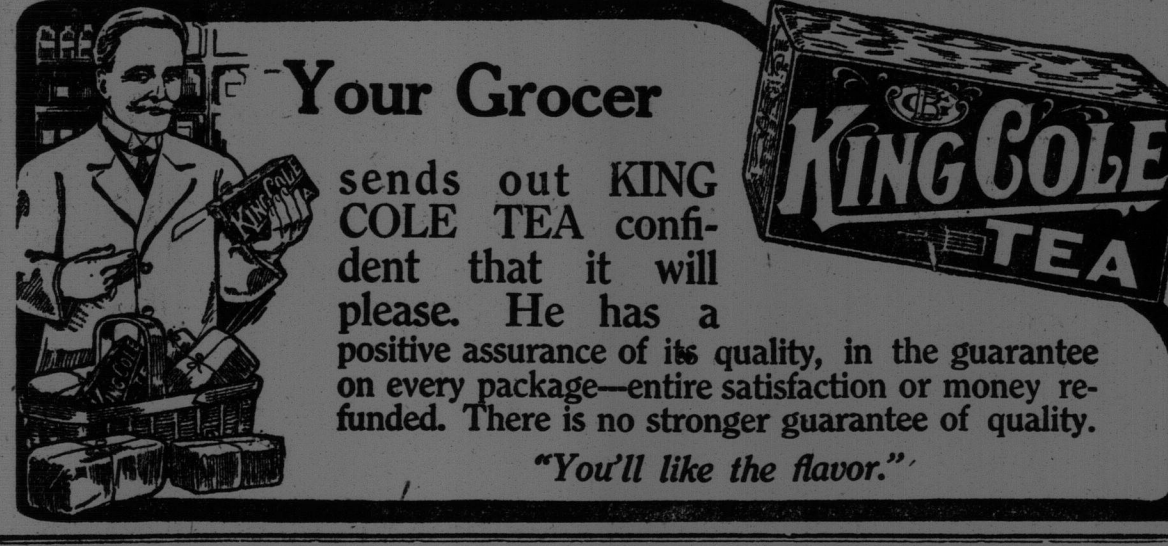

"I was four hours cleaning my coat yesterday," writes Pte. William J. Walsh, G. O. R. "The mud on it weighed ten pounds. Some fellows cut eight to ten inches off their coats, and look like bunnies."
Bring in Wounded at Night
"Our stretcher work is some job," writes Stretcher Bearer W. H. Boyce, Grenadiers, to his grandfather in Toronto. "In the day time we stay in the trenches ready to render first aid, and at night we carry the dead and wounded back to our dressing station."
Big Shells Do Terrible Damage.
"So far we have been lucky enough to keep from fighting with a 'coal box,'" writes Pte. W. Chittenden, of the 2nd Battalion. "One of these German shells can certainly do their share of work. We often pass a place where a church used to stand, but it is nothing but a pile of bricks and mortar now."
Exchange Songs and Shots.
"We are only a little more than 100 yards from the German trenches, and at night we exchange songs and shots with them," writes Pte. Allan L. Coburn to his wife in Brockville. "You can hear like bullets."
