Testing Strength of Arch

Spokane, Wash., July 22—Workmen have just completed at a cost of \$8,000 a 60-foot concrete arch in Spokane which is to be weighed down until it falls. During the next 90 days a series of experiments will be conducted by engineers to ascertain the carrying strength of the arch, which was designed by John G. Lynch, a Spokane contractor. The new design combines principles of the cantilever arch and beam design. The arch is constructed of concrete formed in tubes, with walls eight inches thick, and reinforced with steel, and is about 40 feet high. The ends are left unsupported.

Morton Macartney, city engineer, will supervise the first 90-day test, following which it will be kept under a load for 60 days longer to determine what deflection or distortion results. Sand will be used for the weights. After all the tests have been made the arch will be deliberately weighed down until it breaks.

Mrs. Rhoda E. Raymond.

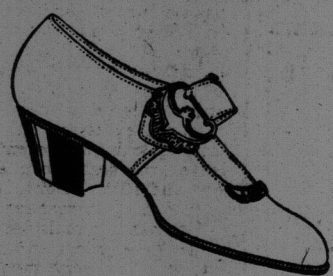
