**DENIES LEONARD IS DODGING CHICAGOAN**

Billy Gibson Says Charlie White will be Next Opponent of Lightweight Champion.

(New York Times.)  
Billy Gibson, manager of the world's lightweight titleholder, Benny Leonard, was considerably perturbed yesterday by reports to the effect that the champion was dodging his way out of a title match with Charlie White, the Chicago fighter. Leonard was matched to meet White in the Garden ring on March 17, but was forced to call the bout off as a result of an injury to his hand. Johnny Dundee has been selected to take Leonard's place in the ring against the Chicagoan.

"Whether White wins or loses his March 17 engagement with Dundee in the Garden, the Chicagoan will still be the best opponent for Leonard," said Gibson yesterday. "It makes little difference to us on this score. Every one who remembers his whirlwind bout with the champion at Benton Harbor two years ago, knows that a return engagement will prove a great magnet for the fight fans."  
"For that reason I will state that, regardless of the outcome of the White-Dundee match, we will be glad to take on the Chicagoan later in the season and just as soon as Leonard's hand is well enough to allow him to start training."  
It is probable that the Leonard-White bout will be staged either here or in Jersey City on the first Saturday after Decoration Day.  
"I would be in favor of staging the match either at the new arena now in course of construction at 22nd street and Broadway or in the gigantic bowl in Jersey City where Dempsey and Carpentier fought," continued Gibson. "I understand that there will be 25,000 seats in the new up-town arena and I know the place will sell the place twice over if the Leonard-White bout is the attraction."  
In the course of a discussion with Frank Flounoy, the Garden matchmaker, yesterday, Gibson was asked whether Leonard would make the lightweight mark for White.  
"Foolishly," said Gibson, "Why, only today Benny with no training weighed around 136 pounds. He will make 138 pounds at the weigh-in for White and I'll even willing to predict that he will be far below that poundage."

## ST. DAVID'S CHURCH FORMS ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

A new amateur athletic association was created last evening by the young men of St. David's church and will be known as the St. David's Amateur Athletic Association. This newest association's ideal is to stand four-square for amateur principles in sport and it will seek affiliation with the A. A. U. of Canada. The new association will have as its members, creditable entries for all lines of sport. Baseball plans were fully discussed as well as the coming boxing and wrestling meets but no definite action was taken. Preliminary organization work, including the adoption of a constitution and by-laws, took up the time last evening. James Brittain presided. Election of officers will take place next week. It was decided that on the second Tuesday in every month would be the regular meeting night.

## GIRL FAILS TO PROVE CHARGES

Fredericton, March 10.—(Special)—James A. Langley, who had appeared several times before the police magistrate since his arrest on a serious charge relating to a girl aged thirteen years, was discharged this afternoon. Magistrate Limerick taking the ground that evidence corroborative of the statements sworn to by the girl and her mother, had not been produced.

## BIG EMBEZZLEMENT IN PHILADELPHIA

Philadelphia, March 10.—Walter A. Unger, charged with the larceny of securities of the Evans Dental Institute of the University of Pennsylvania valued at "more than \$100,000," and the embezzlement of \$12,000 of the Institute's funds, is under arrest. He had \$10,000 in cash in pockets, according to the detectives.  
Unger, who was assistant treasurer of the dental institute fund, disappeared Feb. 28 and the next day it was found that negotiable securities of the institute said to have been worth \$190,000 were missing from a safe deposit box in the Girard National Bank. It was also alleged that he had withdrawn from the bank \$12,000 in cash belonging to the institute.

## PONZI ASKS SUPREME COURT TO PREVENT TRIAL BY STATE

Washington, March 11.—Charles Ponzi, now serving a five-year sentence as a federal prisoner for violation of the law prohibiting the use of the mails to defraud in connection with his high financing methods, contested through counsel in the supreme court the efforts of

the State of Massachusetts to obtain him for trial on an indictment charging him with twenty-two offences under the state laws.

The United States District Court at Boston ruled against him, and he now has an appeal pending in the Circuit Court of Appeals. The latter court asked the supreme court to advise it whether with the consent of the attorney general, the State of Massachusetts could lawfully obtain possession of Ponzi while he is serving his federal sentence.  
Counsel for Ponzi insisted that the attorney general had no jurisdiction in such a matter and that the case would be the same whether that official agreed or opposed removal. Chief Justice Taft asked why Ponzi opposed trial at this time, and when informed that the prisoner did not want to lose his "liberty," caused an outburst of laughter by stating that he was not aware Ponzi had any. Massachusetts desires to proceed with the trial of Ponzi before the expiration of his federal sentence, because some of its witnesses may, it fears, die or disappear in the meantime.

## LIBERALS TENDER LARKIN DINNER

(Canada Press Despatch.)  
Montreal, March 10.—Addressing the Liberals gathered at a banquet tendered him here tonight Hon. P. C. Larkin, high commissioner for Canada in London, described himself in the phrase of Mark Anthony as "a plain, blunt man," and said the powers of organization which he had practised over a long period in Canada would undoubtedly be usefully employed in London. The fact that Mr. Larkin used to go to his office in Yonge street, Toronto, wearing a high hat, was mentioned by one speaker as an indication that he would probably become a beau brummel in London and in any case eminently qualified him for

the position he was about to take up in the capital of the Empire.

Hon. James A. Robb, minister of trade and commerce, who was also present, paid a tribute to the great men who had occupied the post in London and acknowledged the services rendered by its late holder, Sir George Perley.

## EVENTS IN BELFAST.

Lieutenant Bruce, of the Seaforth Highlanders, was murdered in the Falls Road district of Belfast last evening by a party of men supposed to be Sinn Feiners. The motive for the murder is not known. Constable Cullen, who was shot earlier in the evening, died later from his wounds. Constables O'Connor and Cullen were attacked. O'Connor was shot dead and Cullen died later. An official statement issued last night says that since February 11, twenty-two Catholics and seventeen Protestants have been killed in Belfast. The total number of fatalities since July, 1921, is given as 125 Catholics and forty-two Protestants.

## THREE 'CHAPS' HOLD UP LONE STAR OF GUN FAME

'Plumb Disgusting,' Says Indian Scout, Renowned in the '70s, as a Fast Shooter.

Omaha, Neb., March 11.—Fred M. (Lone Star) Hans of Omaha, Indian back in the days of 1876 to 1881, and renowned at one time as one of the fastest shooters of a single action pistol in the world, was narrating to two companions the story of "Custer's last fight" when the trio was held up and attacked by three hold-up men who entered a grocery store and escaped after robbing their victims.

Today Hans said that it was "plumb disgusting to let that fellow and the two chaps that followed him into the store take my money, but what could a fellow do unarmed against three men, each with a pair of guns apiece?"  
Hans, who investigated the Custer massacre for the government, was also instrumental in bringing Sitting Bull back to the United States from Canada.

In Cheery County, Neb., eighteen miles southwest of Valentine, on April 12, 1877, he shot and killed two stage robbers, both of whom had the drop on him.

In 1876, in the "Hole in Wall" County,

Powder River, Wyo., he shot and killed three stage robbers and never suffered a scratch.
