#### SEAPLANE HELD.

The seaplane which landed here on Saturday from Bar Harbor has been held by the federal authorities pending a decision from the air board in Ottawa concerning its status. The regulation in regard to planes landing here is that they must be marked and registered and the pilot must have a certificate with him. E. K. Jaquith, the pilot, said they had not intended to come as far north as this but had become lost in the fog and could not find a harbor any closer. Both he and W. L. Struth, his companion, thought the regulation a wise one but regretted that ignorance of it was liable to keep them here for some time. Mr. Jaquith showed that it would hardly be a profitable business for him to be engaged in rum running. The federal officer said he was holding the plane until he received word from Ottawa but that the men were under no restraint.

#### STRIKE VOTE OF GREAT LAKE VESSEL CREWS.

Buffalo, June 28.—A strike vote is being taken between 12,000 and 15,000 employees on Great Lake vessels, against wage cuts from \$150 a month in 1921 to \$100.
