APPEAL TO BRITAIN ON BEHALF OF POLITICAL PRICONERS IN PORTUGAL

London, Jan. 30—A committee of prominent British residents of Portugal, formed for the purpose of investigating the conditions of thousands of political prisoners awaiting trial in Lisbon and in various parts of the provinces, after examining two prisons containing 1000 prisoners, has issued a provisional report in which it makes a strong appeal to the British government for its good offices.

The committee asks the government to exert its pressure on the Portuguese government to secure fair treatment and the speedy trial of the prisoners so that numberless innocent persons arrested on mere suspicion may be liberated, instead of being kept waiting for months in underground and unsanitary dungeons under condition that are unspeakably filthy and degrading.

According to the report it would appear that some have been incarcerated since the inauguration of the republic.

LEGISLATION FOR SHIPPING USING PANAMA CANAL

Washington, Jan. 30—Senator Bristow, of Kansas, yesterday introduced a bill, the enactment of which he contends would restore the American merchant marine and establish competition between ocean and rail traffic in the coastwise trade by way

of Panams.

The bill would reduce the Isthmian Canal Commission from seven to three members on January 1, 1913, and have the three commissioners control the operation of the canal and the zone government.

The bill would fix a toll of \$1 a net registered ton for all ships; fifty cents a ton for all American vessels, the owners of which agree to permit their use as auxiliary cruisers in war, and twenty-five cents a ton to all coastwise craft on the same conditions.
