"We do not attempt to present the appeal of the wretched drunkard himself; the only object we have in view is to call the attention of the Legislature to a subject of great magnitude in its bearings, inasmuch as it is closely connected with our present pauper and prison discipline, and relates to the well-being of the community and at least three-fourths of those who now crowd our lock-ups and prisons.
