If you are, did you ever realize that there is such a thing as the immorality of wishing?

Probably not.

But isn't there?
I think there is.
Indeed, I think wanting to have things without paying for them in coin or honest labor or sacrifice or desert or some similar specie is one of the greatest immoralities in the world.

It is this attitude which stands behind half the sins and follies, in the calendar.

The thief, the seducer, the gambler and a thousand others are products of the desire to have without paying.

Then, too, over much wishing is enervating.

It has somewhat the same effect upon the character that riding all the time and never using one's legs as God meant them to be used would have upon the body muscles.

Of course, there is more than one kind of wishing.

There is the light hearted, nonchalant wish that says cheerfully, "It would be fun to have one of thouse touring cars to go rushing around the country in," or "Wouldn't it be great to live in a big house like that?"

The first kind of wishing is useless, but harmless if not indulged in too much. The second is both useless and harmful.

Wishing is like steam, useless, but harmless if not indulged in too much. Wishing is like steam, useless, and sometimes dangerous when allowed to escape, but capable of accomplishing great things when harnessed.
