The Raid On England East

A small German fleet consisting of three cruisers made a sudden dash into the North Sea on Wed nesday morning last and shellad Hartlepool and Scarborough, two cities on the east coast, a little over 200 miles north of London. Several buildings were damaged and a number of people were killed and wounded. Fifteen schoolboys were killed by a single shell. Ten people were killed by the collapse of a building.
