Take advantfirst day of November, 1921, respecting the Lobster and other Fisheries,

No person shall kill, take, Catch, sell or can any Lobsters, nor shall any person engage in the business of canning lobsters, at any place, or on any portion of the coast in the Colony, for a period of three years commencing on the First day of January, 1925, and ending on the Thirtyfirst day of December, 1927.
