CANNY INSECT WORKERS.
They Fertilize Flowers For Strictly Utilitarian Reasons.
A correspondent writes: "The theory of the origin of flowers by the selection of insects is one which has attracted much attention both in scientific circles and from the general public. Set forth by Darwin in the 'Origin of Species,' it has been largely developed in a paper published in the 'Gardeners' Magazine' by Mr. Grant Allen. Some fresh and interesting light has been thrown upon the subject by a series of experiments recently carried out by Professor Plateau of the University of Ghent. Electric Propulsion of Ships.
Up to the present electricity has scarcely been thought of as a propelling power for the larger type of vessels. This is undoubtedly owing to the fact that for a given horsepower a triple or quadruple expansion steam engine would take up less space and probably weigh less than an electrical propulsion of the same power. Storage batteries are out of the question for such uses, although persons not well up in electrical subjects frequently wonder why our ocean-going vessels are not propelled by some such method. It may interest some of our readers to know that a vessel requiring a power of 10,000 horsepower to propel it across the Atlantic, and displacing 5,000 tons, would be obliged to carry, were storage batteries used, a mass of 324,450,000 pounds of such batteries, or 30 times as much as the ship—Electricity.
