Boston's sugar shortage was allayed somewhat by the arrival there yesterday afternoon of the American steamer Choctow, from Jucaro, Cuba, with 5,760,000 pounds of raw sugar for the American Refining Company. The vessel wend direct to the refinery at South Boston, and the work of breaking out the cargo and rushing it through the process of refining began immediately.

The steamer Lake Beacon, from Nuevitas, Cuba, with 6,500,000 pounds of sugar, which was expected at Boston yesterday, was intercepted by wireless and diverted to New York.

Sails For Belgium.

The United States Shipping Board steamship Ossawatomie, which has been assigned to the Red Star Line for its Boston-Antwerp service, is loading 400 tons of barley, soap, machinery, candy, pulpwood, canned milk and of their cargo, and will leave Boston Saturday for New York to take 150 head of cattle to restock Belgian farms.

British Official at Berlin May Control All Exports.

Cologne Sept.—Mr. Charles Knott. president of the British Chamber of Commerce in Germany, has had a series of interviews with the Finance Minister of Economics and Food Controller, with the object of proceeding further with the suggestion of the scheme for a clearing house to be established in Berlin, so that absolute and effective control of all exports from Germany to the British Empire and of imports from British Empire and of imports from British to German Germany to the British of the Ministry of Economics and Food to be under a British official, who will have entire control of the Ministry of Economics and Food to be under a British official. Mr. Knott is laying the proposals and details of the scheme before the Board of Trade, and he is extremely confident that the Board will take it up.—London Exprese.
