The history of the voyage of the steamer Arndt, whose long-delayed arrival occasioned such dread misgivings, is related by Captain Felberg, who had command of the steamer on her perilous passage. The steamer left Stettin, Prussia, on the 3d of July, and arrived at Havre after five days, July, and arrived at Havre after five days, where she took on board 213 steerage passengers, who made a total of 399, besides 37 saloon passengers. On the sixth day out, at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon, a terrific rumbling was heard, and the vessel came nearly to a standstill, and all on board rushed on deck to see what the matter was. On going to the stern of the ship the propeller was found to have disappeared, and not a vestige of it was to be seen. As soon as the extent of the disaster was ascertained, Capt. Felberg put the ship under all possible sail, and determined, although she was nearer England than New York, rather than turn back, to make the latter port. Numerous vessels passed her, two during a fog and two at night; but although the whistle was blown, guns fired, and the whistle was blown, guns fired, and rockets let off to attract their attention, rockets let off to attract their attention, it was to no purpose. On the 30th the Banks of Newfoundland were reached during a thick fog. The Arndt was 1,750 miles from New York when her propellor fell out, and made that distance in thirty days, despite the most vexatious head winds and calms. Sixteen miles was the smallest distance made in a single day, and 180 the greatest. At no time were the passengers put on rations, although once when the fresh meat gave out they were obliged to subsist on salt, to make

There was not a single case of sickness during the voyage, and when the vessel arrived the health of the passengers could not have been in better condition.
