A very valuable volume, proving "the gradual progress which the Indian tribes, under the care of Friends, have made from a state of wandering barbarism to one of a settled and civilized character," and lamenting the "unjust and oppressive treaties on the part of the Federal Government," under whose paternal care the 325,000 Indians of the last census were fast disappearing.
