The petitioners are the four uncles of the deceased, William, John, Robert and Elias Thomas. They claim to be the next of kin to their nephew. They allege that he never made a will but that a lorged document purporting to be a copy of an alleged lost will of the deceased was the means by which the probate court of King county was induced over a year ago to distribute the property.

Thomas went to the Yukon severa years ago. He met his death while fording Stewart river. He was quite wealthy. The beneficiary of the alleged will, which has been probated befriended him, it is stated, while he was in need. He had for years been absent from his home in Ireland where his uncles reside.
