The Late Edward Fulton.

Dear Sir,—In union with the temperance and reform workers in the whole province, the Kings County Temperance Alliance, at their last meeting, by a rising vote, expressed their profound regret for the death of that great and good man, Edward Fulton, of Bass River. By his death, at a comparatively early age and in the midst of his usefulness, Nova Scotia and Canada have lost an ideal citizen, and the cause of temperance and reform one of its ablest, most conscientious, and most courageous advocates. We cannot pay his memory a greater tribute than to quote the Herald editorial:

"A clear thinker, a logical and conscientious speaker, a ready and forceful writer, Mr. Fulton was a man of broad vision, tender sympathies, and with his heart set on doing his utmost to leave the world better than he found it, and hence he was a most enthusiastic advocate of reform on all lines where it appeared to him that the lot of his fellow-man could be improved. Now that that tongue is forever still and the pen has dropped from his lifeless hand, who is there in all Nova Scotia to occupy and fill his place as an exposé of shame, a denouncer of wrongs, and a persistent advocate of reforms to improve the conditions of human life?"

His memory will ever remain green in the hearts of his fellow-workers. Hundreds will mourn the death of such a man as Edward Fulton; but the grief will be greater in his own home and family, and to them we extend our sincere and heart felt sympathy. H. Acadia Inter-Collegiate Champion.

Acadia, the strong favorite for the inter-collegiate title, made good the claim last Friday by defeating the University of New Brunswick by the score of 13 to 3. U. N. B. fought hard and gained the distinction of being the first team to score on Acadia this season. The territory play is not at all indicated by the score. U. N. B. had Acadia on the defensive frequently keeping the play in their opponents' territory for long periods, particularly during the first half, and crossing their goal line more than once. Just at the close of the first half U. N. B. after a series of hard scrimmages went over Acadia's line for what looked to be a try. Referee Buckley decided otherwise, however, saying that the time had expired before the Red and Black went over.

The game was played in rain, and the field was wet and slippery, being covered by pools of water. The weather conditions hardly could have been worse. The backs were at a disadvantage as far as passing was concerned and punting and dribbling was resorted to by both teams as much as possible. The result was that the crowd of several hundred spectators saw a fairly open and interesting game.

This victory makes Acadia the inter-collegiate champion for the fourth consecutive year. If the trophy is won by that college in 1913 it becomes its permanent property. Acadia won in decisive fashion, and had the superior team. In all divisions of the field Acadia had the advantage of U. N. B., in weight. The local college outplayed Acadia, however, in dribbling, the Wolfville men being unable to stop the U. N. B. forwards when they started on a play of that species. The sole try of U. N. B. was made on such a play. Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole holder of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead of pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
