or cordings, as preferred, made diagonally across them. The back is given a new effect by the arrangement of its fulness in a backward-turning plait extending to the shoulder at each side of the center, the plaits meeting at the lower edge between lapped plaits that flare becomingly. The waist is made over a lining fitted with double bust darts and the usual seams and closed at the center of the

front. The standing collar is closed at the left side and ornamented with rows of the baby ribbon, and three steel buttons are arranged on its overlapping end. The two-seam sleeves, which are made over coat-shaped linings, are gathered at the top, and above the elbow two diagonal clusters of three small tucks or cordings are formed; they may be plain at the wrist or completed with pointed, turn-down cuffs that flare over the hand. Pointed, ripple caps are added, but they may be omitted. A wide wrinkled black satin ribbon encircles the waist and is bowed at the back.

Vailing, silk, cashmere, étamine, poplin, etc., will make a charming basque-waist of this style.

We have pattern No. 1767 in seven sizes for ladies from thirty to for y-two inches, bust measure. For a lady of medium size, it needs four yards and three-eighths of blue taffeta silk twenty inches wide, with three-fourths of a yard of white taffeta silk in the same width for the vest, and half a yard of chiffon forty-five inches wide for the ruffles.
