proceedings of the Trustees and Jurors of the Parish with respect to the Poor and other persons, with their remarks upon things which it might prove expedient to do in order that no means be left untried to induce the Poor to abandon vicious courses, to compel them to earn their living by working honeftly, to prevent them from avoiding labour in the expectation of obtaining relief from the Parish, and also to prevent poor Children from being bred in idleness and to accustom them to work from their infancy, which Court of General Quarter Session of the Peace shall order that the Clerks of the Peace do draw up a summary of the reports and observations transmitted by the several Parishes, and which Court shall thereto subjoin its own remarks and observations upon the things necessary to be done for the promotion of the purposes of this Act, and shall transmit a copy thereof to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person Administering the Government of the Province for the time being, and also to each branch of the Legislature of the next enfuing Session of the Provincial Parliament.

XXVI. And be it further enacted by the auth rity aforelaid, that any person or persons who shall offend against this Act in any matter or thing, for the breach whereof no penalty is herein specially imposed, shall for
