C A P. LXXXIII.

An Act for regulating the carrying of Passengers to and from the Island of *Newfoundland* and Coast of *Labrador*. [25th June 1816.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled *An Act for regulating the Vessels carrying Passengers from the United Kingdom to His Majesty's Plantations and Settlements abroad, or to Foreign Parts, with respect to the Number of such Passengers*: And whereas an Act was passed in the Forty-fourth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, to exempt Vessels in the *Newfoundland* Trade from the Provisions of the above recited Act of the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, whereby the Conveyance of Passengers from the United Kingdom to *Newfoundland* and *Labrador* is no longer subject to any legal Provisions: And whereas it is expedient to make special Regulations for the Intercourse between the United Kingdom and the Island of *Newfoundland* and Coast of *Labrador*, so far as regards the Conveyance of Passengers and the providing them with proper Accommodation, and an adequate Supply of Water and Provisions; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That before the sailing of any Ship or Vessel from any Port or Place in the United Kingdom to *Newfoundland* or the Coast of *Labrador*, with Passengers, the Master or other Person having or taking the Charge or Command of every such Ship or Vessel, and the Owner or Owners thereof, shall enter into Security by Bond to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in the Penalty of Five hundred Pounds, with Condition that

Master of Vessels to enter into Bond not to take more Passengers than by this Act allowed.
