

DOWN IN THE EASTERN COAL COUNTRY MANUFACTURING IS NOT ALL DONE BY "WHITE COAL." This section of the harbour of St. John, N.B., is one of the busiest in Canada; where the coal-carriers swing in from Sydney and Glace Bay; where the coal-bucket clanks by night and day, and the coal-tugs, such as the well-known Maggie M. warp the coal barges across the harbour to the city. In the back ground is the curious case of the great grain belt installed by the late Mr. Blair. Far beyond are the rock-bound ridges of the hills called Fort Howe.
