## Minister says students not needed on aid bodies

WINNIPEG (CUP) - Student Ministers of Education because representatives are not needed on the two bodies that hash out most of the federal student aid policy, according to Manitoba Minister of Colleges and Universities Ben Hanuschak.

If students want to have input into the rules and regulations covering student loans they should either "work through the provincial department responsible for student aid" or talk "directly to the federal minister responsible for administering the Canada Student Loans Act."

The National Union of Students has been campaigning vigorously for the past year for student representation on student aid decision-making bodies at the federal level, but with no success. According to NUS executive secretary Dan O'Connor, the

reasons given by Hanuschak for excluding students is "the same tired line we've been getting for the past year.'

"The federal-provincial game plan on this issue has become increasingly clear. The provinces say we should stay off the decision-making bodies because answering the question."
