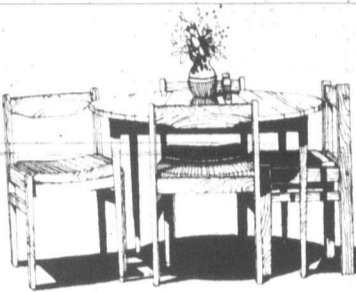

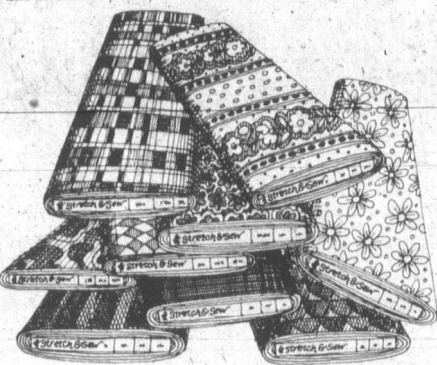

69 per cent in Peel poll support land development industry controls

Almost 70 per cent of Peel South constituents polled in April believe the land development industry should be subjected to wage and price controls, a survey by MP Don Blenkarn indicates. Blenkarn said he was surprised that 69 per cent of the 5,400 respondents replied in favor of the controls.

Only 22 per cent were against the controls in the fourth of a series of Dialogue questionnaires. Other returns showed that while 67 per cent of respondents feel there is an energy crisis in Canada only 48 per cent agree that no further natural gas or hydro should be exported.

At the same time 83 per cent believe that in the long run the nation should prohibit the export of crude oil and allow only refined petrochemicals to be exported. Of those who answered the poll, 86 per cent believe equity ownership in any pipelines, railways and refineries created in the development of northern oil and gas resources should remain Canadian.

Responding to Blenkarn's suggestion of immediate price and wage freezes for 60 or 90 days 64 per cent agreed and 27 per cent said no to the proposition. Polling on individual freezes was 58 per cent for the automobile industry, 55 per cent for primary steel, 46 per cent for banks, 56 per cent for food processing, 59 per cent for the oil industry, 46 per cent for business machine industry.

Almost three-quarters or 72 per cent feel that all governments should be limited to levying taxes up to 30 per cent of gross national productivity even though the control would limit some social welfare programs.

Blenkarn said the country is now spending 37.7 per cent of the GNP on governments.

The Peel South MP admitted that returns to his questionnaires had fallen off from 20 per cent of the ridings 105,000 voters to about 12 per cent but he noted returns carried much more comment than previously.

\$8,000 gift for hospital

Mississauga General Hospital has received an \$8,000 gift from the Mississauga Industrial Association.

The money will be used to purchase an orthopedic operating table to complement an image intensifier recently purchased by the hospital. The intensifier permits the surgeon to see exactly what he is doing when performing orthopedic operations.

The 10-year-old Mississauga Industrial Association is comprised of persons employed in any industry or business engaged in manufacturing, warehousing or services dealing primarily with other industries in town. It has 200 members.

Erindale environment workshop

More than 50 delegates concerned about the oil industry and the environment of Canada are expected to attend a workshop at Erindale College today (Wednesday).

Oil and the Canadian Environment, organized by Erindale professor Wyman Harrison, has attracted scientists, environmentalists and oil company officials from the United States and Canada.

The seminar is to assist in "rationalizing and integrating present and future research programs", Harrison said.

Christian Studies graduate

Yvonne Green, a housewife and mother of three, is the first part-time graduate of the Centre for Christian Studies.

As a field project in her course, the Hickory Drive resident worked on an experimental confirmation program. She will spend the summer in clinical pastoral training and hopes to work part-time with the Anglican Church while continuing her studies at university.

She is a member of the Church of St. Luke in Mississauga.

Streetsville lawyer suspended

A Streetsville lawyer, who made payments from his trust bank account contrary to Law Society of Upper Canada regulations, has had his right to practise suspended.

John Hunter Campbell, who has his office at 200 Queen St. in Streetsville, was reinstated in a statement from the Law Society. He was suspended April 27.

The statement said that the former director of the Ontario Securities Commission won't be able to practise "until he establishes to the society's satisfaction that he has rehabilitated himself and that he is capable and competent to resume the practice of law."
