Province of Nova Scotia have against the fish which comes from here. So do not let us lay every disadvantage at the door of Confederation.

I want my friends of the Province of Nova Scotia to feel that our friends from the other provinces have realized that there were difficulties down here; they have realized that there were things which should be straightened out, and my friend Mr. King has done the most effective and businesslike thing which could possibly have been done. He has not simply made speeches, he has not run elections on promises, but he has given us a concrete body before whom we could present our difficulties. That body has made findings, and these findings are now being implemented.

With regard to the appointment of a Deputy Minister of Fisheries, legislation has already been passed for it. Harbour commissions? Legislation has already been passed for those as well.

Let me say one word with regard to the steel industry. You will remember that the Duncan Report recommends that there should be a bounty on steel to the extent of the amount of Canadian coal which is used in the manufacture, and that so far no legislation has been passed putting that into effect. The reason is obvious. It was accepted by the press all through this
