

Q U E B E C (continued)RemarksCAP-DE-LA-MADELEINE

From Mayor J. A. Nadeau, May 14, 1935: 734 men over 16 employable. From Dept. of Labor: Total relief expenditure, from 1930 to July 1934, \$479,141.25, of which \$135,395.08 for public works. Dominion proportion, \$196,114.07. At times, over 3000 on relief.

CHICOUTIMI

From Mayor J.E.A. Dubuc, M.P., April 23, 1935: Heads of families, 1,115; Single men, 140; Widows, 22; Old men, 42; Dependents, 5,971.--Total on relief, 7,290.--It means a proportion of nearly two persons on relief of each three inhabitants of that municipality.

HULL

From Lt. Colonel W. F. Hadley, President, Relief Committee, April 30, 1935: Heads of families, 1,084; Single, 54; Dependents, 4,727. Total on relief, 5,865.

MONTREAL

According to instructions from Mayor Camillien Houde, six men worked for two weeks on the classification of the unemployed according to their trades or previous occupations, under General E. de B. Panet, President, Unemployment Relief Commission of the City of Montreal. Bilingual return received April 30, 1935, showing 44,579 heads of families on relief.--From the Dept. of Labor, in Feb. 1935, 41,250 heads of families and 11,840 individual cases were on relief, the total on relief being 191,778. The total joint expenditure for relief in the City of Montreal for 7 months ending Feb. 1935 was \$8,527,349.--Individual cases, which are over 12,000 now, should be added to the number of unemployed heads of families. RIVIERE-DU-LOUP

From Mayor L. P. Lizotte, K.C., April 10, 1935: 326 heads of families on relief, including 59 families of railway men; 1,600 dependents.

ST-HYACINTHE

From Alderman Victor Chabot, Barrister, April 4 and 18, 1935: 235 heads of families and 225 single men on relief.

x SHERBROOKE

From Léonard Préfontaine, Secretary-Treasurer, May 3, 1935: Heads of families on relief, 681; Dependents, including single employable, 2,686.--Total, 3,367.

SOREL

From A. O. Cartier, City Clerk, May 15, 1935: 608 heads of families and single men employable; 1,700 on relief.

THETFORD MINES

From Mayor T. Labbé, April 24, 1935: Heads of families, 300; Dependents, 1,353.

x VERDUN

Very comprehensive bilingual report, rather ethnical than technical, but most interesting, prepared under the instructions of Mayor H. Ferland, by P. H. Lane, Director of Verdun Unemployment Relief Commission, April 16, 1935:
