Sir,-

I beg to inclose form of surrender, in duplicate, of grazing rights on the unsurrendered portion of the Peigan Indian Reserve, for a period of ten years commencing at the expiration of the present lease, which you will be good enough to submit to the Indians under and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act. I may say that, if the Indians consent to surrender, it is proposed to call for tenders for a lease terminable on a year's notice, three hundred head of cattle to be allowed, subject to a reduction in the number with a consequent reduction in rental. The existing fence becomes the property of the Indians at the end of the present lease.
