

Dear Mr. Wilson -

I have your further letter of the 29th ultimo, in reference to the transfer of the boys from Battleford. I note now that there are three but the Principal does not state their names or ages. This information should have been given. However, in your letter of September 12th you quote from Mr. Matheson's communication as follows - "There are two boys (pupils) here whose time is about out, and they have expressed a wish to go on with learning some special trade &c." I take it from this that they are near the age limit and it should not, therefore, be necessary for any one to escort them to Elkhorn. If considered absolutely necessary, however, you may go to Battleford for these boys.

I am enclosing a blank requisition for transport which you can have filled in to meet the circumstances.
