
Ottawa, August 3, 1916.

Sir,-

I have to inform you that under an arrangement made some little time ago with the Manitoulin Lumber Company, by which the Department decided to continue renewal of their license up to the 30th of April 1919, provided they complied with the regulations of the Department, the Company relinquished some 5,000 acres of land in the township of Robinson, so that the Department might be in a position to place same in the market.
