you had obligated yourself to about \$1,000?

- A- 66. Well, I had snother car I had traded in. I actually owed about \$320.00.
- Q- 67. At the time how much money did you have to have to own the car outright?
- A- 67. Around \$300.00.
- Q-68. And at the end of about 7 months you had paid that off?
- A- 68. Yes sir.
- Q- 69. That was all clear?
- A- 69. Yes sir.

BY THE PROSECUTOR: Would the Court ask the accused if he were his uniform while away?

ACCUSED QUESTIONED BY THE PRESIDENT

- Q- 70. What did you do with your uniform during these months of absence?
- A- 70. I kept it in my kit bag.
- Q- 71. At your sister's place?
- A- 71. ,I used to keep it where I was staying.
- Q- 72. You carried the bag around with you but wore civilian clothes while working?
- A- 72. I didn't carry the bag around with me, I kept it where I was staying.

- ----- The accused resumes his seat.
- ----- The Defence is closed.
