Q- 70. What did you do with your uniform during these months of absence?

A- 70. I kept it in my kit bag.

Q- 71. At your sister's place?

A- 71. I used to keep it where I was staying.

Q- 72. You carried the bag around with you but wore civilian clothes while working?

A- 72. I didn't carry the bag around with me, I kept it where I was staying.
