I beg to enclose a letter, for your information, received from Mr. A. R. McDonell with respect to expenses incurred in freighting dried salmon to Babine.

The first information I had of this expense was a telephone message from Mr. McDonell on April 21st when I advised him to pay the Indian and pass the account through this office. I may say that I am sending my cheque for \$3.00 to Mr. McDonell to-day.

The shipment on which this expense was incurred was taken by a Babine Indian ~~MAN~~ who visited Smithers with his team for supplies and no notification was made to this office at that time.

I am enclosing a copy of my letter to Mr. McDonell, regarding the distribution of the dried fish, to which he refers. This shipment was sent direct to Mr. McDonell by Mr. Indian Agent F.J.C. Ball at the request of the Fisheries Department.

I shall be glad if you will kindly return Mr. McDonell's letter at your convenience. I may say that I have made a copy of same.
