LETTER BAGS AT THE EXCHANGE.

London. British Queen, will close Monday next Liverpool. Ship Anne, do do.

TWELVE O'CLOCK.—The Telegraph announces 20 Square Rigg'd Vessels and a Schooner.

The ship *Edmund*, arrived this morning, brought up ten of the crew and one passenger (Mr. Levey), belonging to the *Kingston*, which was lost.
The bark *Esmerthorpe*, Captain Storey, arrived here on Wednesday, spoke the ship *Robertson*,

Neill, of Greenock, on the 16th instant at noon, off Anticosti, all well;—requested to be reported on her arrival. At 8 p. m. the wind having increased, and the *Esmerthorpe* being light, she got away from the *Robertson*, and lost sight of her on Monday the 6th. The *Esmerthorpe* experienced very bad weather, strong winds accompanied with snow storms.
Captain Mitchell, of the bark *Bee*, arrived yesterday morning, reports having seen, last Sunday, near the South West point, of Anticosti, a ship and two vessels near, or alongside, and remained so the whole day. Capt. Mitchell was of opinion that she was a Mohrtal trader. It is generally believed here that she is the *Robertson*, Neill, from Liverpool.
Captain Lakeman, of the *Tweed*, saw a vessel near the Grand Etang, in distress; blowing a gale at the time. On the 10th April, in lat. 47, long. 18, spoke the ship *Kobley*, requested to be report d at Quebec.
Captain Farrey reports that a fishing boat in-formed him that there was a large bark on shore at Mile Valley, Wylie, spoke on the 20th April, in lat. 46, lon. 43, 47, W., the *Matthew Bell*, of Quebec, bound to England. On the 5th May, of Cape Rey, out 27 days, the *Mormion*, of London, bound to Riviere-du-Loup.
The bark *Brunswick* arrived at Gros-Isle, reports a vessel ashore on White Island, another on Harz Island, and a brig on Anticosti; also reports the *brigadier*, of Watford, with 5 passengers ashore on Green Island.
The ship *Borneo*, Gorman, 6th April, from Lamerick, arrived at Gros-Isle on Monday, with 233 passengers.
A beautiful ship of 300 tons, built by Mr. Thos. Oliver, was safely launched from his ship-yard at St. Rochs, on Tuesday morning. She was im-mediately towed by the *Lumber Merchant* to Reynold's Wharf, where she has commenced load-ing. She will sail for London, under command of Captain Wetherall.

Montreal, May 16.—Since our last the Ship Toronto and the Bark Chipewa have arrived in port, making it all five large vessels, at present un-load-ing, and creating a bustle and activity to which the city has been long a stranger.—Transcript.
