The only notion he could get from them of a difference between a live and a dead person was that the dead do not breathe. He infers that they are immeasurably inferior to the paleolithic man of Europe, who fashioned tools and hunted big game with his flinttipped arrow and knife. Intellectual atrophy is the result of the Kubus' environment. The words they know are almost as few as the ideas they try to express.-Philadelphia Record.

The 214th anniversary of the Old Swedes Church at Wilmington, Delaware, was celebrated on Trinity Sunday.





In 1860 it was taken to Braceborough House where until lately it served as a receptacle for flowers.
