THE Order for taking into consideration the Copy of the Record of the Proceedings upon the Indictment, in the Court of King's Bench, for the District of *Montreal*, against *Charles Baptiste Bouc*, Esq. a Member of this House; and also for the said Mr. *Bouc's* attending in his place, being read—the House proceeded to take the same into consideration.

And the said Copy of the Record of the said Proceedings in the Court of King's Bench was read, and is as follows:
